NEWS AND NOTES October 22, 2017

⊕ During Communion distribution, the Communion hymn is sung. As long as people are still communing, the next consecutive hymns in the hymnal are sung. We do not stand for doxological hymn verses during Communion distribution.

⊕ Today's opening hymn (940) is the Hymn of the Week. Our Wyneken children worked on stanza 1 this past week.

⊕ In Adult Bible class we continue our study of the Epistle to the Hebrews. Why did the Son of God take into himself flesh and blood? Come, join us in this valuable time of give and take in relation to God's Word. Frequently, as a bonus, members volunteer to prepare refreshments for this class. Thank you to those who do this.

⊕ Wyneken parents who attend worship here with their Wyneken children are reminded to initial their column on the special books in the narthex. Recall that each Wyneken child(ren) and their families must attend at least 14 services at the church to retain their member tuition status.

⊕ With all of the catastrophes and human displacement occurring around the world (even in our own U. S. from the recent hurricanes), members are encouraged to donate to charitable agencies such as Lutheran World Relief and Lutheran Church Charities. When giving, for instance, to LCC, they are a dollar for dollar charity...whatever you give toward a SPECIFIED need, will be given completely to that need.

⊕ Our guest preacher next Sunday will be Rev. Dr. John Nordling, professor of exegetical theology in Ft. Wayne. Dr. Nordling will also be teaching the Adult Bible Class between the services. Next Sunday is Reformation Sunday and Dr. Nordling will be preaching and teaching on the assigned readings for this Sunday.

⊕ The 95 Theses, nailed to the church door in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517, launched the Reformation with the Scriptural truth of salvation through Christ Jesus alone. 500 years later, on October 31, 2017, we will celebrate the Reformation with a worship service at 7:30pm in the seminary Kramer Chapel. The Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, president of the LC-MS will serve as preacher. The CTSFW Kantorei and Schola Cantorum, will provide special music, as will the Chamber Choir from Concordia Lutheran High School, Ft. Wayne. ⊕ Make sure to look at the Luther displays in the narthex and the parish hall, as we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Thanks goes to Marcia Selking for these informative displays.

⊕ Save the date. Our annual church bazaar is coming up! It will be held November 18, from 10:30am-1pm. There will be a luncheon along with crafts, noodles and baked goods. Please plan on attending.

⊕ Now Accepting Snow Removal Bids: Wyneken Memorial Lutheran School is accepting snow removal bids for the 2017-2018 school year. Bids should include a per hour rate to clean lot anytime we get 2" or more of snow. (Lot will need to be cleared

by 6am on school days.) Bids should additionally include cleaning of sidewalks at 2" accumulation, and salting lot per occurrence. The school may also call you for special circumstances of less than 2" at our discretion. All bids should be returned to school office or current school board member by Tuesday, Nov. 7th, 3:30pm.

⊕ For those undergraduates who are considering training in either pastoral ministry or diakonal service, Christ Academy College (for men) and Phoebe Academy College (for women) offer a firsthand experience of how Concordia Theological Seminary (CTSFW), Fort Wayne, forms its students in accord with a confessional Lutheran identity. The four-day event, taking place **November 2–5**, immerses young men and women in the classes, worship and day-to-day life which shapes pastors faithful to the Holy Scriptures and deaconesses who are equipped to share God's love and mercy through diakonal service. The opportunity also affords students time for fellowship with their fellow brothers and sisters considering vocations in church work, and to meet those already at the Seminary either as seminarians or faculty. "The most memorable experience for me," a participant from a prior year stated, "was being able to meet the professors and having time to wrestle with theological questions." There is no charge for this event, which includes both housing and meals. Christ Academy College/Phoebe Academy College also offers limited reimbursement for travel as available, though you will need to inquire with the Admission Office for details.
